\$38 MILLION CAPITAL INVESTMENTS

In 2023, the CIC facilitated projected that improved, expanded or attracted businesses resulting in \$38 Million in new capital investments in Putnam County. These economic development investments grew existing companies, attracted new businesses, retained and created jobs, developed commercial and industrial real estate, enhanced public infrastructure and helped keep people working, spending and living in Putnam County.

\$3 MILLION+ IN GRANTS

Several grant applications were successful and a new program helped three women-owned businesses win \$75,000 in grants for new technology and equipment.

BUILDING CAPACITY IN PUTNAM COUNTY

A core function of the CIC is building capacity to tackle complex challenges impacting the county. In 2023 these were:

- 1 HOUSING: completed the county's first housing analysis, marketing to developers, and helping communities craft new housing incentives.
- 2 FINANCING: qualifying building construction projects can now access new incentives and Better Buildings Northwest Ohio, PACE financing (in Energy Savings Improvement Districts).
- (3) CHILDCARE: collaborative work among business, childcare and agencies to expand services.
- WORKFORCE: Marked 1st anniversary of The Workforce Partnership of Putnam County.
- 5 SITE DEVELOPMENT: preparing sites, redeveloping buildings and remediating brownfield sites.

LOCAL & REGIONAL CONNECTIONS

The State of the Vision annual meeting was held 8.3.23 on the campus of Endera where tours were given for **172 guests**. Founder and CEO John Walsh spoke about "Why Ohio" and Chase Eikenbary from RGP/JobsOhio gave state program updates. The CIC highlighted the local & regional economy, announced small business grant recipients and presented annual awards.

Leading Initiatives

88 businesses, organizations and individuals investing in the CIC. The 2024 goal is 120 member investors.

Education & Training: 12 training events attended by 42 businesses and 7 villages impacting over 5,000 workers and first responders. The CIC manages the Build Putnam portal to ensure the public is aware of local careers, sponsors the Safety Council of Putnam County, coordinates Putnam County Educator Bootcamp bringing educators into local manufacturing facilities, and helps businesses earn OhioTech Cred.

Leadership: a new Leadership Putnam County certificate program for companies and nonprofits developing talent, and individuals seeking growth.

Community Impacts: growing & attracting housing developers and helping villages create housing development incentives. Participated in comprehensive planning for one community and served as project leader for a second community.

Workforce: The Workforce Partnership of Putnam County marked its 1st anniversary in 2023. The CIC planned with partners for two years to create the entity which is helping prepare and grow a highly-skilled local workforce.

Transportation: spearheaded creation of a Transportation Improvement District to access additional funds for roadwork projects.
